**THE MACHAKOS COUNTY HEALTH SERVICES BILL, 2019**

**Hon. Chairperson:** Hon. Members, let us execute this as soon as possible so that we can be able to finish it as soon as possible.

**Hon. Masesi:** Mr. Chairman, I beg to move THAT Clause 3 of the Bill be amended by:-

- (b) Inserting the following new paragraph immediately sub-clause (e) —
- (f) "provide for measures to be undertaken towards the attainment of universal health coverage;
- (g) "provide for measures to be undertaken towards the attainment of universal health coverage;"

  - (4) A person is qualified for appointed as the Chairperson of the Service under paragraph (2) (a) if that person has a first degree from a recognized university and a minimum of ten years’ experience in the management of public affairs.
  - (5) A person is qualified to be appointed as a member of the Service under paragraphs (2) (f) and (g) if that person has a minimum of a diploma.
  - (6) The persons referred to in subsection (2) (a), (f) and (g) shall serve for a term of three years renewable for one further term.
  - (7) The Chairperson of the County Public Service Board shall present the names of the persons appointed under subsection 1 (a), (f) and (g) to the Assembly for approval.
  - (8) Any person may recommend to the Assembly for the removal from office of a member of the Service on the following grounds—
    - (a) Gross violation of the Constitution or other written law;

- (b) Incompetence;
- (c) Gross misconduct; or
- (d) Bankruptcy.

Functions of chief executive officer

6. (1) The Chief Executive Officer shall—

- (a) Be the secretary to the Service;
- (b) Be the head of the secretariat of the Service;
- (c) Be the Accounting Officer of the Service;
- (d) Be the custodian of the Service's records;
- (e) Be responsible for—
  - (i) the execution of the decisions of the Service;
  - (ii) the preparation and submission to the Service e for approval, programs necessary for the achievement of the Service's mandate;
  - (iii) causing to be kept records of the proceedings and minutes of the meetings of the Service and such other records as the Service may direct;
  - (iv) the preparation of quarterly report on the implementation of this Act which shall be transmitted to the Service; and
  - (v) the performance of such other duties as may be assigned by the Service or any other written law.

(2) The County Public Service Board may remove the Chief Executive Officer on the following grounds—

- (a) Inability to perform the functions of the office due to physical or mental infirmity;
- (b) Incompetence;
- (c) Gross misconduct;
- (d) Bankruptcy; or
- (e) Violation of the Constitution.

(3) Before removal from office under subsection (6), the Chief Executive Officer shall be informed in writing, of the reasons for the intended removal, and shall be afforded an opportunity to defend themselves against such allegations, either in person or through a legal representative.

(4) The Service may delegate to the Chief Executive Officer such of its functions as are necessary to carry out the day to day management of its affairs.

  - (a) one person with experience in matters relating to governance, leadership, management or public policy and who shall be the chairperson;
  - (b) the person in-charge of the Health Center who shall be the secretary;
  - (c) the County officer responsible for matters relating to health in the Ward in which the Health Center is situated;
  - (d) the County officer responsible for matters relating to county administration in the ward in which the Health Center is situated;
  - (e) five outstanding members of the community who ordinarily reside in the Ward in which the Health Center is situated and who have at least five years’ experience in the management of public affairs;
  - (f) a representative of the Community Health Service Providers working in the Ward in which the Health Center is situated;
  - (g) two persons, being one woman and one man who ordinarily reside in the Ward in which the health center is situated representing marginalized groups;
- (3) The persons in subsection (2) (a), (e) (f) and (g) shall be competitively recruited by the County Public Service Board, which shall, in appointing them—
  - (a) take into account regional, ethnic and gender diversity and representation of persons with disability; and
  - (b) ensure public participation by making extensive consultations with the relevant stakeholders, community leaders and members of the public.
- (4) A person is qualified to be appointed as a member of the Health Center Committee under paragraphs (2) (a), (e) (f) and (g) if that person has a minimum of a diploma.
- (5) The Chairperson of the County Public Service Board shall present the names of the persons appointed under subsection (2) (a), (e) (f) and (g) to the Assembly for approval.
- (6) The persons referred to in subsection (2) (a), (e) (f) and (g) shall serve for a term of three years renewable for one further term.
- (7) Any person may recommend to the Assembly for the removal from office of a member of the Service on the following grounds—
  - (a) Gross violation of the Constitution or other written law;
  - (b) Incompetence;
  - (c) Gross misconduct; or
  - (d) Bankruptcy.

- (vi) Receive quarterly and annual reports from the officer in charge and approve such reports for forwarding to the Executive Committee Member;
- (vii) Cause to be kept books of accounts;
- (viii) Undertake such other activities as are necessary for the effective management of the Health Facility.

(3) A person shall be qualified for appointment as the Chief Executive Officer under subsection (1) if that person—

(a) is a citizen of Kenya;

(b) holds at least a first degree from a university recognized in Kenya;

(c) has knowledge, experience and a distinguished career of not less than ten years;

(d) has at least five years’ experience in a leadership position at senior management level in a public service or private sector organization; and

- (e) meets the requirements of leadership and integrity as prescribed under Chapter Six of the Constitution.
- (4) The Chief Executive Officer shall hold office for a term of five years and shall be eligible for re-appointment once.

  - (c) treating common ailments and minor injuries, as first aid, with the support and guidance of the Community Health Extension Workers;

I have talked at length with the Chairperson of Finance committee because of the finance Bill and CBROP which are important documents that need to be passed before 31st of December this year. So, the work of committees will still continue and the report writing will continue irrespective of the decision we are making today. The only time you remember Members when you go easy on committees and writings particularly the week just before Christmas and after Christmas. We have a set way of doing things around this time.

Secondly, because of the Bill and any other matter of County importance that might arise or Nation importance that might arise we will have special sittings called when it is necessary.

*(Applause)*

Finally, on the issue of participation of Members, this is a matter we have discussed with the Chair of Chairs; I attended the Liaison committee I think last week and we agreed that all Members should be able to participate on the business of the House and the business of the House starts in committees and so that is still an instruction and a direction and an order from the Chair which is still standing.

*(Applause)*

So, let us have all Members participate in the business of the House so that even when it finally comes to the floor they feel they are part and parcel and that is how it is supposed to be. So, Members, with those remarks I now put the question.

*(Question put and agreed)*

*(Applause)*

So, Members let me ask that you take great advantage of that opportunity, I will personally be there also, I need a lot of training like each one of you so that we can see how we will improve in service delivery to the people of Machakos County.

### **PROCEDURAL MOTION**

ADJOURNMENT FOR LONG RECESS FROM 8TH DECEMBER, 2020 TO 9TH  
FEBRUARY, 2021

**Hon. Speaker:** Hon. Members, under this business, we have the Hon. Majority Leader Mark Muendo but Hon. Minority Leader, Alex Kamitu is still holding brief in that regard.

**Hon. Kamitu:** Thank you very much, Hon. Speaker.

Hon. Speaker, that aware that Standing Order 24(1) provides that except for the session commencing immediately after a General Election, the regular sessions of the Assembly shall commence on the second Tuesday of February and terminate on the first Thursday of December;

Noting that crucial business has been transacted during this session including approving budget of the County for the Financial year 2020/2021, facilitating Public participation on various legislative proposals, discussions with respective departmental accounting officers on budgetary implementations;

Acknowledging that the House approved an Assembly Calendar pursuant to Standing Order 25(1) and aware that the Calendar of the Assembly guides the House on when to have a break and when to resume sittings; aware that the recess will afford members time to interact with their electorates and relax over the December festive season;

Further aware that Standing Order 25(3) provides that on a day when the Assembly is scheduled to adjourn to a day other than the next normal sitting day in accordance with the Assembly Calendar, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party or another member of the House Business

Committee shall move a Motion of adjournment which shall be debated for not more than three hours after which the Assembly shall adjourn without question put;

Hon. Speaker, I beg to move the motion that this Hon. House adjourns its sittings as per the Calendar of the Assembly from today, 8th December, 2020 and resume on Tuesday, 9th February, 2021.

Thank you, Hon. Speaker.

**Hon. Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Minority leader. Who is seconding your Motion?

**Hon. Kamitu:** I now call upon Hon. Majority Whip Moses Mitaa to second the motion. Thank you, Hon. Speaker.

**Hon. Speaker:** Hon. Majority Whip.

**Hon. Mitaa:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker; I second the motion.

**Hon. Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Majority Whip. The position Hon. Members, is that we are supposed to maybe just have some few brief comments but no question is going to be put. Do we have any Member who is opposed to this? Hon. Kisila.

**Hon. Kisila:** Madam Speaker, I am actually in support but I just want us to since now we have passed our budgets including the supplementary budget, it is very important as we take a break, we find a working formula with the.....I like the way the Assembly has worked with the executive over the years. We need to find a formula of how we are going to engage with His Excellency the Governor together with the executive so that we can agree on how our projects will start being worked on since our time as *Mheshimiwa* Mitaa is putting, actually we have 13 months to go to our end of our term and the ground is not as rosy as it looks and it will be good that we start having some good development working together with His Excellency the Governor.

So, I want your guidance on how we will engage the executive together with His Excellency the Governor during this recess. Will you guide us on whether we are going to engage with the leadership of the House, you leading it so that we can know how the projects will start being implemented on the ground? That is what I wanted your guidance on.

**Hon. Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Kisila. Any other Member who has anything to say? Hon. Chief Whip.

**Hon. Mitaa:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker. I think just to add on your communication if you allow on the issue that was raised by Hon. Jeremiah Munguti. It was noted that, we have had Members who have been invited in committees and there was some miscommunication so they missed to receive their payments but Hon. Speaker, I wish to remind them that the issue has been since addressed through the Liaison committee under your guidance they will receive whether they have missed for the period they have missed and that, going forward, each and every Member will be in position to have equal committee sittings. Thank you, Hon. Speaker.

**Hon. Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Mitaa. Any other Member? Let me come to the issue that was raised by Hon. Kisila on the engagement with the executive during the recess. I really feel the concern Hon. Kisila and it is the concern of every other Member that the term of this Assembly is coming nearer, if it is 13 months it is just a year of 12 months and it is the wish of the office of the Speaker particularly myself that I would want to have Members having it easy on the ground much as I am MCA No. 1 here and much as the public would actually see the Members who were elected by them like the Whip and the DS and Hon. Kisila, Minority Leader and the others as the ones answerable to them, I also get a lot of bashing especially in my area.

The roads are still in a very deplorable situation and the Members are crying out to see development on the ground. So, it is not only you who are feeling it, I am also feeling it so I am called for any of such meetings, I will attend and again I will also lift the phone and I will call the Governor and I will tell him the concerns of the Members.

*(Applause)*

I will tell them they have really co-operated. If it means to co-operate they have and so there should be reciprocation at least for that period remaining; so I will deliver the message.

The other issue raised by Hon. Mitaa I am uncomfortable with the expression that the Members who have missed in the past will have their payments processed. There are two Members who raised the issue with me; actually Hon. Constance Mbula and Hon. Nyawira because those are Members who sit in committees that I chair like Powers and Privileges which you know hardly has business every other day so they have been missing out.

When they came to me about one week ago, they asked me about what they have missed and I told them I can do very little because you can imagine now going back to write those documents. I cannot promise myself but if the department of finance can do I have no objection if the Members can be facilitated but I told them going forward, make sure that the invitation...because the question has been invitation is not backed by records...just a moment Hon. Chief Whip.

They were saying they go to seek their payment and they are asked where the evidence for your attendance is. So I was saying and I mentioned in the Liaison committee if there is an invitation I even do an internal memo, I say I have so and so invited to attend to our committee but I also learned there is a permanent invitation. Permanent in quotes to some Members so if that is there that is a record that can be used to pursue whatever claims the Members may have. Beyond that, appreciate that I am not the accountant. Mine is to issue the directions and my directions have been that I have always said let Members who are not making it be part and parcel of the business of the House and that is the spirit of the House. So there we are, Hon. Mitaa. We can discuss that in a *Kamukunji*.

Then there is the issue of me thanking you Members now; we have come to up to today more or less the last sitting of this session that is the gazetted session and I appreciate that we have not closed. If we could we would have even held our final sitting in the training but we cannot mix business. So what I want to say is that you have performed wonderfully as a House.

*(Applause)*

We have passed crucial Bills that with your guidance and oversight they will go a long way to assist the people in this county and I want to urge you to insist on the implementation of



those Bills. You will see improvement in the health sector. I cannot wait to see the big smiles on the faces of the voluntary health care givers. I cannot wait to see the face of the youth who will now be attending vocational training. I can wait to see the re-engineering of the co-operative movement in agriculture in Kenya and you have passed many others.

So what I want to say is that we will come back Godwilling and let us desire to do even more so that we leave a good legacy in the 12 months or so and for those who will come back they will continue to carry on. Then I know in this period we faced the greatest challenge as the Covid-19 and some of us fell victim but we thank God that we survived and I know that there are quite a number of Assemblies that lost a number of Members much as we empathize with those families, we thank God that he preserved us here.

So I can only ask that you take the break, you continue working and you continue taking care of yourselves your families and the people you represent against the infection from Covid-19.

**Hon. Speaker:** So with this Hon. Members, the sitting of this House will stand adjourned---

**Hon. (Ms.) Munyasya:** Maybe you can ask the Members to pray for our Hon. Senator Kabaka.

**Hon. Speaker:** Sorry. Thank you, so much, Hon. Angela. I think we can close this business of the adjournment and then we can; just like extraordinary AOB. Is that okay? So Hon. Members, I note that you have agreed we are going to stand adjourned. The motion proposing the adjournment has passed that is from 8th December, 2020 to resume on Tuesday 9th February, 2021.

However, because we are also living in circumstances that we need to go out of the ordinary a bit because of circumstances that are facing us and our county, we may have something to say perhaps on Hon. Kabaka that is the Senator for our county. The report is that he has been unwell; maybe Hon. Angela is a neighbor back home so she may just tell us how the current status is. The current status of the Hon. Senator and then after that we can say a word of prayer for him.

**Hon. (Ms.) Munyasya:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker. As of the sickness of Sen. Kabaka he has been unwell, he has been down with Covid-19. He was hospitalized for some time in the last two months then his wife was also hospitalized for the same; actually for a longer period because she was discharged last week. So when she was discharged, I spoke to him last on Wednesday last week and he was well. He said he was doing very well because we actually talked for more than one hour he was explaining about Covid-19 and how we should be careful about the disease and how it does not just leave you instantly that it goes on and on and his wife was getting well.

So, it is on Thursday that I was told he has been taken ill again and he was in hospital so I spoke to the wife and she told me there is a lot on stories on social media but I am not concentrating on the stories on social media. She said he collapsed and was admitted at Nairobi Hospital where he underwent an emergency surgery because he had a clot in the brain. The

suspension was the Covid-19 had affected his brain and I think it is a normal thing for Covid-19 to go and get you having a clot in the brain.

So after the operation he has been in ICU. I spoke to her this afternoon as we were having lunch at around quarter to 2.00 p.m. and she said he is still in critical condition so we should pray for him and that is the way it is. We should continue praying for him and hope he gets well. Thank you.

**Hon. Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Angela. Thank you very much. Hon. Members, I think it is always the prayers of those who are able that deliver those who are not able to pray for themselves. We have the duty and it is a calling from so we will ask Hon. Jacinta to lead us with a prayer. Foremost for the quick recovery of the Hon. Senator Kabaka and strength for his family and then you also pray for each Member here and our families as we disperse until God puts us together on 14th of December noting that in the meanwhile you will be meeting as small groups in the committee report writings. Hon. Jacinta, please.
